Please vote YES on March 5th. The referendum seeks approval by the majority of Captiva registered voters, and is conducted by the Lee County

Supervisor of Elections office. This referendum is being held to obtain authorization to incur a significant indebtedness, secured by all Captiva properties. Please come out and vote. The last referendum, in 2010, was approved by 78% of voters and we again asking for your approval.

The 2020/2021 Beach Renourishment Project is estimated to cost \$30 million. Consistent with the methodology of past successful projects, the program may include financial support from governmental agencies and the Captiva Island property owners. It is estimated to cost the homeowners on Captiva no more than \$18 million, funded through a bond and assessed at actual cost once the work is completed.
